Program Requirements

A Minor in Urban Studies requires the completion of 18 credit hours. All students in the Minor are required to take Introduction to Urban Studies as a foundational course.

- **Required Courses (3 credit hours):** URBS 2200/GEOG 2200 – Introduction to Urban Studies (3)
- **Elective Courses (15 credit hours):** The remaining courses may be selected from the course options on the Urban Studies Minor webpage as well as any additional courses listed above:

- Students may also count up to 9 hours of other courses that have a significant urban focus with the prior permission of the Director of the Minor in Urban Studies Minor. Such courses must be open to all urban studies students and not restricted to majors only.
- With prior permission from the Urban Studies director, students may also select from: URBS 3801 Independent Study in Urban Studies (3) and/or URBS 4401 Internship in Urban Studies (3).
